Job Description

This is a developmental Environmental Planner position designed to cultivate a well-rounded professional capable of navigating the complexities of Environmental Planning within the Air Force. Under the mentorship of a senior Environmental Professional, you will manage, execute, and operate assigned tasks, projects, and programs while actively participating in a formal training and development plan. Responsibilities include providing expert environmental advice, guidance, and oversight into infrastructure project planning to ensure compliance with federal and local regulations, implementing short-term goals to support the Installation Development Plan utilizing urban or town planning principles. You will also be responsible for coordinating environmental training programs for the installation. The initial grade for this position is S-11 target S-12, contingent upon meeting experience and/or all regulatory training requirements.

Qualifications and Key skills

One of the following:

- An accredited Bachelors or honors degree in Community Planning/ Biological sciences / Environmental engineering/ Physical Science/ Engineering or technology, or in a related field
- An accredited Higher National Certificate (HNC) or Higher National Diploma (HND) in engineering or technology started before September 1999
- An HNC or HND started after September 1999 (but before September 2010 in the case of HNC) or a Foundation Degree in Community Planning/ Biological sciences / Environmental engineering/ Physical Science/ Engineering or technology, or in a related field, plus appropriate further learning to degree level (i.e. NVQ Level 6)
- A National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) or Scottish Vocational Qualification (SVQ) at level 4, plus appropriate further learning to degree level (i.e. NVQ Level 6)
- Equivalent qualifications or accredited apprenticeships, or at an equivalent level in a relevant national or international qualifications framework.

*All qualifications are to be in the appropriate field for the position.

**All qualifications are required to be accompanied by at least 1 year's specialized experience.

In order to qualify you must demonstrate in your CV or application the following key skills

A valid UK CAT B driving license

Possesses comprehensive knowledge of professional environmental principles, practices, and procedures to oversee project development, execution, technical training, and advisory services. Experienced in investigating and troubleshooting complex environmental challenges, including unsanitary or non-compliant conditions, while ensuring strict adherence to applicable Federal and local laws, health, safety, and environmental regulations across restoration, conservation, and pollution prevention programs. Demonstrates proven skill in leading and integrating interdisciplinary teams composed of engineers, scientists, legal counsel, public affairs, and regulatory officials, backed by the ability to communicate technical data clearly, concisely, and effectively to build strong stakeholder relationships.

Conditions of employment

1. You will be required to handle and safeguard sensitive information in accordance with applicable US and UK laws, rules and regulations. This position may also be coded as mission essential.
2. You may be required to travel by military and/or civilian aircraft, and you may also be required to travel to the US or other country, in the performance of official duties or attend necessary training.
3. You will be required to complete a 6-month probationary period.
4. Your work schedule is flexible to meet mission needs. Overtime and other duties appropriate to your grade and skills may be assigned.
5. You must be able to communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
6. This position is part of the Acquisition Professional Development Program (APDP). The incumbent must obtain Level II certification in Facilities Engineering within 24 months and maintain it by earning 80 Continuous Learning Points every two years. You may be required to obtain job-related certifications
7. You may be required to serve as a member of the Emergency Response Force during exercises or in the event of an actual emergency.
8. Regular drug testing is not conducted under the Local National Direct Hire (LNDH) Program; however, testing may be required due to reasonable suspicion of substance abuse or after a safety mishap/accident.

NOTE: You will require a **UK NATO** security clearance and a right to work in the UK
